- **This Week in Naval History:** In 1944, the Battle of Leyte Gulf, considered the largest naval battle of World War II, begins with the U.S. submarines attacking two elements of the Japanese armada moving towards Leyte. In the Palawan Passage, USS Darter and USS Dace sink heavy cruisers Maya and Atago (Takao is also hit, but survives). Off Manila Bay, USS Bream's torpedoes damage the heavy cruiser Aoba.

Rear Admiral (upper half). Peter Garvin is a 1989 graduate from the United States Naval Academy. His operational assignments include service with the "Pelicans" of Patrol Squadron (VP) 45, department head with the "Mad Foxes" of VP-5; navigator aboard USS Kearsarge (LHD 3), Commanding Officer of the "Fighting Tigers" of VP-8; and Commander of Patrol and Reconnaissance Wing (CPRW) 10. As a Flag Officer, he served as the 22nd Commander of Navy Recruiting Command and, most recently as Commander, Patrol and Reconnaissance Group, Pacific. Rear Admiral Garvin became the 20th Commander of the Naval Education and Training Command July 9, 2020.
