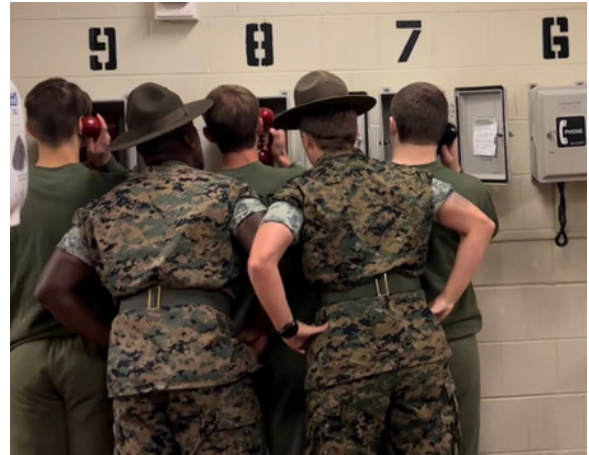
PARRIS ISLAND

Cadets went to Parris Island, SC from October 18-21. While there, we experienced a small portion of what a Marine Recruit goes through daily. That includes: reveille, p.t. (personal fitness), chow (meals), drill. We went through the different levels of training each recruit experiences during boot camp: started on the yellow footprint where all marines start their journey, grass week, swimming week, and their final week with the Crucible.

At the Crucible, we participated in the exercises that recruits do to show mastery of skill and teamwork: walk through the gas chambers and conduct exercises that show leadership within the Marines. Later, we were given an overview of the basic warrior training and participated in the team building confidence course, where we did many of the obstacles.
